Padua and Venice



Padua

is the capital of the Province of Padua and home to around 220 000 people. It is situated on the Bacchiglione and

Brenta Rivers and is home to a vast array of Medieval, Baroque and Romantic architecture. It hosts the University of Padua, founded in 1222, where later Galileo Galilei was a lecturer between 1592 and 1610.

Padua is a picturesque city, with a dense network of arcaded streets opening into large communal piazze, and many bridges crossing the various branches of the Bacchiglione, which once surrounded the ancient walls like a moat.

Venice is renowned for the beauty of its setting, its architecture, and artwork. It is situated across a group of 118 small islands that are separated by canals and linked by over 400 bridges. It has been ranked as the most beautiful city in the world.



Rome

Rome is Italy's capital city and home to more than 4.3 million residents and it has a separate country within its



own city limits, the Vatican. Rome has a documented history of at least 28 centuries, with mythology having it as much older. Rome was the home of the Italian Renaissance and is to this day full of the treasures and learnings of the masters including da Vinci, Raphael, Galileo, Copernicus.

It is home to some of the most recognisable structures in the world, the Colosseum, St Peter's Basilica, the Fountain of Trevi and much more. Rome is one of the most visited cities in the world.
