LANGUAGE: JAPANESE

COURSE TYPE: BACKGROUND SPEAKERS

LEVEL: STAGE 2 (Year B)

This course focuses on developing skills in exchanging, analysing and evaluating information, opinions and ideas. Detailed information is available from the Subject Outline accessible from the SACE Board web site: http://saceboard.sa.edu.au

Within the set Themes studied through a range of texts, students extend their knowledge of Japanese and reflect on, respond to aspects of the language and culture of Japanese speaking communities.

Students are assessed through a series of required assessment types as outlined in the Subject Outline. A Learning and Assessment Plan for students and parents is available on the class Edmodo at the beginning of the course. As per SACE guidelines, students will be assessed against set criteria. Grades will result from student performance against the Performance Standards at A+ to E- level. In order to make the most of student potential, 5 capabilities have been incorporated into the language program. These capabilities are: communication, citizenship, personal development, work and learning. The capabilities enable students to make connections in their learning within and across subjects in a wide range of contexts.
