About Spanish

Spanish is a global language spoken by approximately 500 million people across the world. Due to a steady history of migration from Spanish-speaking countries to Australia, Spanish remains an important community language throughout Australia.

As Spanish belongs to the family of Romance languages, knowledge of Spanish can facilitate the learning of other languages from the Romance family, such as Catalan, Galician, Italian, French, Portuguese and Romanian.

The majority of learners of Spanish in Australia are studying it as a second or additional language. There are also a number of background learners of Spanish, who have varying degrees of prior knowledge of the language.
