From the Principal: Lia Tedesco

Term 1 commenced well; and we now have 2162 enrolments at this point in time – our highest enrolment ever!

Languages with the most enrolments this year are Chinese (394), Spanish (277), French (198), Japanese (168), Khmer (151), Italian (139), Nepali (129) and Vietnamese (126).

Since our last newsletter, we have established another new teaching centre: Sunrise School at Marion, where we are teaching Afrikaans, Auslan and Chinese at primary level.

We have just completed an External School Review. The Report will be available on our website by the middle of next term. We are really pleased with our improvement journey as a school, and we look forward to the Review Report, which will provide directions as we develop our next 3 year plan.

We are, like you, prepared for any school closures that may arise due to Covid 19, and prepared to return to online classes at short notice.

From time to time, we may also need to cancel face to face classes in a particular Teaching Centre. In these cases, we will offer the lesson online at the usual time. We understand that not all students may be able to participate; but please remember that all teaching materials are always available on Edmodo.

I wish you all safe and rewarding April school holidays; and hope that the students are all looking forward to returning to their language studies in Term 2!

Looking back over our 35-year history Did you know?

- The School of Languages is a government school established in 1986 to offer language learning that complements and supplements languages programs in mainstream schools and ethnic schools.
- In 1986 the school taught 6 languages to 155 secondary students. The school's name was the South Australian Secondary School of Languages (SASSL). We were based at 71 Rose Street, Mile

End until 2006.

- In 2021, we offer 24 languages to over 2,160 students from all schooling sectors, in 29 different locations (Teaching Centres) around the metropolitan area.
- Our goal remains the same: to enhance access, choice and continuity in quality language learning for SA students.


Entries will be categorised according to four groups:
