<p>This course focuses on developing communication skills in Hindi (speaking, listening, reading & writing), developing understanding of language as a system and enhancing intercultural understanding.</p> <p>Within the set Themes, Topics and guiding questions, students are given an opportunity to improve their communication skills, and their understanding of the language and the culture. Hindi language acquisition supports and is supported by Theory of Knowledge. It provides for students an opportunity to reflect on their own learning, develops higher-order thinking skills and helps students to become aware of their own perspective, as well as an awareness of multiple perspectives. Students are assessed through a series of required assessment types as outlined in the IB Language Guide. As per IB guidelines, students will be assessed against set criteria. At HL students read two works of literature. Literature will be used as a stimulus for individual oral assessment.</p>
