A recent Cambridge University study has found that young people who consider themselves multilingual tend to perform better across a wide range of subjects at school, regardless of whether they are actually fluent in another language. The study of more than 800 students in England found a measurable, positive relationship between their personal connection with other languages, and their GCSE exam results in both modern language and nonlanguage subjects. This applied whether or not they actually spoke a second language fluently. We thank them for their contributions to our students and to our school; and we wish them all well in their future endeavours!


## **GOVERNOR'S RECEPTION**

The centre has 32 children participating in the program each year following a curriculum that offers a steady flow of diverse subjects and activities with an emphasis on having fun with their French, Indigenous and English languages during their two-hour lesson each day.
