
Reception to Year 6 -Crunch and Sip

Let's Talk!

During the July holidays, on Thursday 14th and Friday 15th, we once again ran **Let's Talk!** our state government funded program for secondary students of languages. This time we were very excited to trial an online parallel delivery for some languages. Face-to-face sessions for Chinese, French, German, Indonesian, Italian, Japanese and Spanish were run face-to-face on the Thursday but

in addition, 6 secondary students of Indonesian, Japanese and Spanish, including a student from the Northern Territory, joined in the activities online.

In total 80 students participated over the 2 days and took up this unique opportunity to develop their speaking skills in the language they are studying through the highly interactive learning experiences on offer. It may have been the school holidays, but the corridors of the School of Languages were a buzz with the sound of so many languages being spoken. This is what some students had to say about the program:

In the July school holidays the world of language and culture once again came alive in the R-6 Languages Alive! holiday program offered by the School of Languages. Children explored the mysterious and enchanting Burmese language, role played being a Japanese speaking Ninja Warrior, created their own French comic strips and discovered the ancient and exquisite art of Indonesian wax patterns. This popular holiday program funded by the State Government, is designed to generate a love for learning other languages and an appreciation for other cultures. Over 110 students participated in interactive language learning experiences in Chinese, French, Auslan, Burmese, Japanese, Indonesian and Spanish. This time we took the program further afield to the Eyre Peninsula towns of Streaky Bay and Ceduna!

Staff Professional Development Learning and Assessment Design project

At the start of 2022, our school commenced a 3-year project, in conjunction with Associate Professor Angela Scarino, Director of the Research Centre for Languages and Cultures at the University of South Australia, focussing on learning and assessment design as part of our school improvement plan.

Each year we will focus on developing our staff's professional knowledge and practices related to learning and assessment design in ways that make a positive impact on students' language learning.

We have begun an intensive professional learning series with our Leadership Team exploring contemporary theories and practices related to learning and assessment design, particularly for languages learning. As part of the leadership series, each leader has been designing an individual action research project focussing on a particular aspect of practice.

At the same time, all staff are developing their understandings of learning intentions and applying these in their lesson and module /unit planning.

The project is in its infancy, but we can already see some wonderful professional conversations and positive changes in practice. We will keep you informed of our progress as we travel this learning journey as a school.

Korean at SoL

Our Korean students, taught by Parky Anderson, are enjoying their "game" of fly swatters used to help them revise vocabulary, phrases and grammar.





Hindi at SoL

This term our Yr 4-7 Hindi class students created some wonderful memories in class whilst learning Hindi and expanding their knowledge of Indian culture.
