Welcome to Term 4!

The final term of the year sees our senior secondary students on the home stretch, as they prepare for final exams. We wish them all well as they prepare for their oral and written exams. We would like to congratulate one of our teachers of Spanish, Flor Groenen, who is a finalist in the public education awards. Winners will be announced on 4th November. We are very proud of this achievement, and delighted that Flor has been recognised in this way! Please read her citation below:

Flor Groenen Rangel Senior Spanish Teacher, School of Languages Cultural immersion proves a resounding success for Flor and her multi-lingual learners.

Flor enhances the academic outcomes as well as the self-esteem and wellbeing of all her students by developing multi-lingual learners who are proud of their linguistic and cultural skills, experiences, and identities. Her exemplary Spanish teaching has resulted in her students not only achieving some of the highest grades in the state but also, as she teaches the International Baccalaureate, some of the highest grades in the world. In 2021, in SACE stage 2 Continuers Spanish, Flor had 53% of A grade students across the state in her class, including 3/5 A+ students. By teaching through the lens of intercultural understanding, Flor ensures that her students have the most contemporary, critical communicative and interpersonal skills well beyond traditional language learning.

Regularly engaging in professional learning, Flor is currently studying towards a Master of Education.

She is also involved in a project being run by the University of South Australia's Research Centre for Languages and Cultures focussed on learning design and assessment. The professional development programs run by Flor have directly contributed to the improvement of achievement results across multiple languages. Flor has supported her colleagues to better understand assessment in the Year 12 IB Diploma course which has had a direct impact on learning outcomes with students.







Year 12 Examinations

Most of our Year 12 students will sit their final exams within the next few weeks. Students have been given details regarding the date, time and venue for their oral and written exams.

The updated timetable is provided in this newsletter and on the SACE Board website.

All students of Year 12 IB have their last lesson for the year in Week 10 of Term 3.

Students who have Year 12 SACE exams during the school holidays and in Term 4 Week 1 also have their last lesson for the year in Week 10 Term 3. This applies to:

Year 12 SACE students must be aware that it is not possible to catch up with a missed written and/or oral exam. Students who do not attend their scheduled exam(s) will need to present a doctor's certificate using the SACE Board's proforma; or receive a zero mark for this part of the exam. A doctor's certificate stating that a student was 'unable to attend the exam due to a medical condition' will not be sufficient.

Enrolling for 2023

Our 2023 promotional information is being distributed to all schools and community groups, together with enrolment forms. Enrolment information is also on our school web site.

Re-enrolment of students, Reception-Year 9

We distributed a letter outlining our re-enrolment process for 2023 to all students currently enrolled in Reception to Year 9 in Term 3 Week 9 in class. If your student was absent in Week 9, this information will be posted home. These students will be automatically re-enrolled for the next year level, unless we are advised otherwise by **Friday 11 November (Week 5)**.

Re-enrolment of students, Years 10 and 11

We sent parents/carers of all students currently enrolled in Years 10 and 11 an SMS in Term 3 Week 1 with a link to our website where there is information outlining our re-enrolment process for 2023. This process took place in Term 3 Week 6. Students who intend to continue studying with us in 2023 received a Letter of Acknowledgement in Term 3 Week 9 in class, and will receive a Confirmation of Reenrolment letter in Term 4 Week 6/7 in class. If your student is absent in the relevant weeks, this information will be posted home.

Our digital global connections with Korean High Schools still going strong after 6 years!

Our Year 11/12 Korean students have continued to improve their language skills and make new friends with students from Gimhae Foreign Language High School and Miryang High School in South Korea through our Global Class Connections program (previously known as sister-schools). Students are in regular contact through online Teams meetings; sharing stories, photos, and videos about their daily life in each country.

A popular activity this term has been the preparation and exchange of Cultural Mystery boxes. Our students treated their South Korean friends to a range of Australian delights such as Vegemite and Tim Tams which they will sample in the next Teams meeting! We are also looking forward to receiving culture boxes from our Korean friends and talking about the Korean delicacies in term 4.

Many thanks to Parky Anderson, one of our highly expert Korean teachers for her tireless efforts and commitment in organizing these valuable and engaging learning experiences for her students. They take learning Korean beyond the 4 walls of the Australian classroom into an authentic Korean setting!




