Year 12 Results

We would like to congratulate our year 12 students who studied either a SACE or an International Baccalaureate Diploma language course with us last year.

SACE: 245 students in total completed a SACE Stage 2 language; with 98% of our students achieving a passing grade of C- or above, and 89% of them achieving an A or B:

- 52% achieved an A grade.
- 37% achieved a B grade.
