From the Principal: Lia Tedesco

Welcome back to Term 2; and a particularly warm welcome to those of you who joining us for the first time in term 2.

Every year I am often interviewed by Year 11 and 12 students who are undertaking their Research Projects, to outline why Language learning is an important endeavour. I am always very pleased to answer questions such as these, as it provides a great opportunity to promote the many benefits of being bilingual or multilingual; and for our students to be aware of the value of learning languages.

In addition to the obvious benefits of being able to communicate with people from other languages and cultures (valuable in its' own right), learning languages enriches students intellectually, educationally and culturally.

Intellectually: there is much evidence of the intellectual benefits that accrue from learning languages. Benefits include the development of creative and critical thinking, lateral and analytical thinking, and problem solving skills.

Educationally: languages education is a key ingredient in a comprehensive and well-rounded education. In addition, there is evidence that through learning languages, students' literacy skills (including skills in English literacy) are strengthened.

Culturally: students learn about diversity; and that there are many different ways of viewing and being in the world, and that 'our' way is not the only way. This helps to build social cohesion and openness to other world views and perspectives.

Learning languages can also open up many positive career opportunities for our students, who will be competing on the global stage in their chosen careers, and competing with students from other countries, many of which demand and expect language learning as part of the curriculum throughout schooling. For our students, not having at least one other Language will put them at a distinct disadvantage.

More bilingual and multilingual people also helps to build Australia's strategic, economic and international development, at a time when the movement of people and ideas across the globe is accelerating and expanding.

We are indeed proud of our more than 1700 students who are learning a language with us this year; and who make the effort week after week to attend classes after hours, so that they can develop as linguistically and culturally aware citizens of the world.

Mobile Phones

As you would no doubt be aware by now, all schools have been asked to develop a new Mobile Phone Policy to replace the policies developed in 2021. Those policies do not allow students to use their mobile phones (or other digital devices) during lessons, unless for a designated learning activity. The key change with the new policy is that students will not be allowed to access their phones during the break as well as during lessons. Our school will be implementing the new policy from the beginning of Term 3. Key elements of the School of Languages new policy will be summarised in the Term 3 newsletter.
