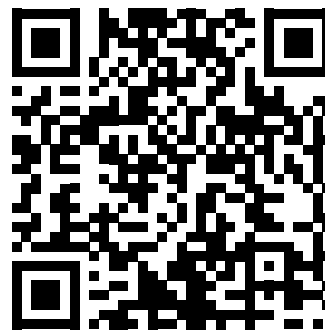

ABOUT FRENCH

French is a major world language, spoken as the first language in more than two dozen countries on five continents and as an official language in 33 countries.

Since the eighteenth century there has been a steady movement of French speaking migrants to Australia, with approximately 0.5 percent of the Australian population identifying as having French ancestry. France is a leading destination for Australian travellers and students, and a partner in work-exchange opportunities in hospitality, tourism and international relations.

French uses the same Roman alphabet as English. There are many similarities between the two grammatical systems and many shared words, but also differences, such as in the use of tenses, the gendering of nouns and adjectives.

For Reception - Year 10, courses follow the Australian Curriculum: Languages. Teachers will use the curriculum to cater for learners of different backgrounds by making appropriate adjustments to differentiate learning experiences for these students.

In Years 11-12, French is available at Beginners and Continuers levels.

Years R-10: \$150
