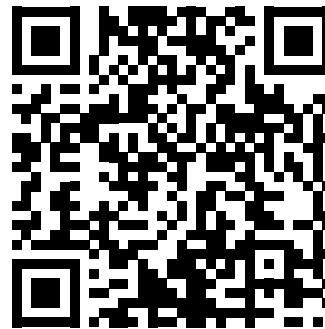

ABOUT NEPALI

Nepali is a member of the Indo-Aryan language family, spoken by 11,826,953 in Nepal (2011 Nepal Census), 2,926,168 in India (2011 Census of India), and 265,000 in Bhutan (minorityrights.org). Worldwide there are over 17 million Nepali speakers (translatorswithoutborders.org).

Nepali (also called Nepalese) is the national language of Nepal. Most of the country's population speaks Nepali as a 1st language, and many speakers of Nepal's 122 other languages speak it as a 2nd language.

Nepali is also the official language of Sikkim, an Indian state in the Himalayas, and in the Darjeeling district of West Bengal.

The sound system and grammar of Nepali share many features with other Indo-Aryan languages. The basic vocabulary of Nepali is Sanskrit in origin, but over the years the language has also borrowed words from other languages. While written Nepali is mostly influenced by Sanskrit, spoken Nepali has many loan words from neighbouring Tibeto-Burmese languages.

Nepali was first used in writing during the 12th century AD. It is one of the Languages written in Deranagari script.
