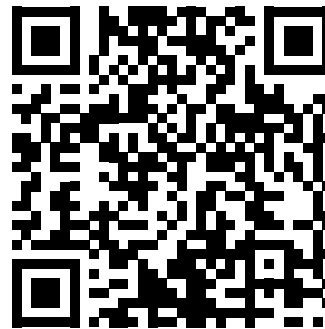

ABOUT THAI

Thai is a Tai-Kadai language spoken by over 69 million people mainly in Thailand and also in the Midway Islands, Singapore, the United Arab Emirates and the United States.

It is the official language of Thailand, the 50th largest country in the world, almost equal in size to Spain. More than 92% of the Thai population speaks Thai. It is used when dealing with Thailand through import/export businesses, missionary work, aid workers for international organisations, tourism, investors, foreign embassies and other areas of diplomatic exchange.

The Thai language is closely related to Lao, and northern dialects of Thai are mutually intelligible with Lao, particularly the Lao spoken in northern Thailand. The Thai vocabulary includes many words from Pali, Sanskrit and Old Khmer.

Like Chinese and Vietnamese, it is a tonal language meaning that the same word can have a completely different meaning depending on how it is pronounced. In total, there are 5 tones: Mid tone, high tone, low tone, rising tone and falling tone. For example, the Thai word mai, can have many meanings including “wood”, “not”, “silk”, “burn”, and “new” depending on what tone is used to pronounce it.
