Dear members of the school community, as 2023 draws to a close, I would like to thank all students. parents, carers, staff and Governing Council members, well as as our colleagues in the various teaching

centres around the metropolitan area, for your support in making this year another successful year for our school!

As many of you know, I am retiring, and therefore this is my last newsletter. I look back with pride on all that the school has achieved; I look back with gratitude to all the staff, parents, carers and students who I have worked with over the years; and I feel privileged to have met such a diversity of community and stakeholder groups, all of whom have contributed extensively to the success of the school.

My strong belief is that all students should have access to languages education, as it expands their world view and benefits them in the longer term, for example in relation to career opportunities, travel, friendships; not to mention the sheer wonder of being able to think and see the world from multiple perspectives.

Our students gain so much from their language learning; so much that goes beyond communication in the target language (as important as that is): they gain a deeper understanding of the world around them; an understanding of other peoples and their way of thinking; an understanding of commonalities and differences.

Since 2000 when I was first appointed to the school, we have introduced many new languages, we have expanded into the primary levels, and at the same time we have continually increased our presence and our enrolments.

We provide a vehicle through which to offer a richer diversity of Languages than any individual school can manage, and thus be more responsive to the individual needs of the thousands of students who have come through our doors. We have indeed come a long way since the schools establishment in 1986; which augurs well for the future under the leadership of the new Principal, Dr Michelle Kohler.

We are now taking enrolments for 2024. You will find our timetables and enrolment information on our school website or ring us on 8301 4800. Lessons in 2024 will commence in the week beginning Monday 6th February.

KOREAN SCHOLARSHIP

Congratulations to Rhea Shibichan, Yr. 12 Korean Beginners student, who won a scholarship to attend the 2023 Korean Education Program for International Youth, held recently in Korea from the 27th November to the 1st December. This is a fully funded program for Year 7-12 high school students learning Korean worldwide. Only 100 students in 32 countries around the world were awarded the scholarship; with Rhea being one of four students from Australia. To win this scholarship, Rhea applied for the 2023 Korean Speech Contest with a recorded speech in Korean in the first round; and she was selected to compete in the final round as one of 8 students in Australia on Friday 20 October. Her winning entry was her 5 minute speech in Korean on the topic, 'Why I learned Korean.'

In Korea, during her stay she met students learning Korean from all the other

countries that participated in the contest; and engaged in a range of interesting language and cultural activities; including a further speech contest in Korea, where Rhea won first prize!
